





SAMPLE SIZE ACHIEVED

MEANINGS, FEELINGS, REASONS

How would you describe the meaning and significance of the 2020 events?

- We realized we are the majority (many) 65%
- Belarusians saw the true nature of Lukashenka's government – 59%
- Hope emerged, faith in possible change 58%

What feelings do the events of 2020–2021 evoke in you today?


- Pride, respect 68% (+9%)
- Anger, rage 51% (-7%)
- Grief, pain 38% (-3%)

Why, in your opinion, did the protest movement in 2020 fail to remove Lukashenka and hold a new presidential election?

- Putin's support kept Lukashenka in power 79%
- The authorities had too strong a security apparatus **58%**


90% WOULD ACT THE SAME WAY OR EVEN MORE DECISIVELY






ALMOST HALF OF RESPONDENTS DO NOT ACKNOWLEDGE THE PROTEST'S DEFEAT


