

ON THE PRIORITIES OF BELARUS–UKRAINE COOPERATION

Warsaw, Poland, 08–09.08.2026

We, the democratic forces of Belarus,

- **supporting** Ukraine's sovereignty, territorial integrity, and right to self-defense against Russian aggression in accordance with international law;
- **emphasizing** that the Lukashenko regime bears full responsibility for its complicity in Russia's war against Ukraine and for making Belarusian territory available for the criminal aggression against Ukraine;
- **recognizing** that Belarus and Ukraine are bound by geographic proximity, shared historical experience, and common security interests;
- **noting** the contribution of Belarusian volunteers, humanitarian volunteers, activists, and diaspora communities to supporting Ukraine, as well as the support Ukraine has provided to Belarusians forced to leave their country due to repression;
- **welcoming** the development of political, parliamentary, and civic dialogue between Ukraine and the democratic forces of Belarus, the establishment of coordination mechanisms, the work of the Inter-Factional Association "For a Democratic Belarus" in the Verkhovna Rada, the opening of the Mission of the Democratic Belarus in Kyiv, and the efforts of the Belarusian community in Ukraine;

adopt this resolution to:

1. **reaffirm** our support for Ukraine's right to self-defense and the restoration of its territorial integrity within its internationally recognized borders.
2. **condemn** the use of Belarusian territory, infrastructure, and resources for Russia's aggression against Ukraine and consider the restoration of Belarus's full sovereignty to be an essential condition for the security of both states.

WE DEFINE THE FOLLOWING PRIORITY AREAS FOR COOPERATION:

1. **Security and Sovereignty.** Coordinate efforts to prevent the use of Belarusian territory in aggression against Ukraine, counter the recruitment of Belarusians into Russian armed formations, and address hybrid threats. Prepare the foundations for future cooperation on border security, information sharing, and regional security.
2. **Accountability and Targeted Pressure.** Coordinate international efforts to document crimes, hold accountable those responsible for complicity in Russia's aggression and the

unlawful transfer of Ukrainian children, and impose targeted sanctions on the individuals and entities responsible.

3. **Rights and Support for Belarusians in Ukraine.** Develop sustainable solutions regarding the legal status, identity documents, and mobility of Belarusians, as well as provide legal, medical, and social support for Belarusian volunteers, veterans, and their families.
4. **Political, Parliamentary, and International Cooperation.** Strengthen cooperation between Belarusian democratic institutions, the Verkhovna Rada and other Ukrainian state institutions, coordinate positions, and work together within international organizations and parliamentary assemblies.
5. **Strategic Communications.** Develop joint analytical, expert, and media initiatives to counter Russian propaganda, disinformation, and attempts to deny the national agency of the Belarusian and Ukrainian peoples.
6. **Education, Culture, and Historical Memory.** Support Belarusian-Ukrainian cultural and educational initiatives, the study of the Belarusian and Ukrainian languages, academic mobility, mutual recognition of educational credentials, scholarship and research programs, and joint reflection on shared historical experience.
7. **Reconstruction and Economic Cooperation.** Promote the participation of Belarusian experts, professionals, and businesses in Ukraine's reconstruction projects and prepare for mutually beneficial economic cooperation following democratic change in Belarus.

WE CALL ON THE LEADERSHIP AND STATE INSTITUTIONS OF UKRAINE TO:

- develop a systematic dialogue with Belarusian democratic institutions and civil society on issues of security, support for Ukraine, Belarus's future democratic transition, and post-war reconstruction;
- establish sustainable mechanisms for political and expert dialogue that will enable cooperation beyond the current wartime context while taking into account the interests and priorities of both sides;
- develop sustainable solutions regarding the legal status, identity documents, and mobility of Belarusians residing in Ukraine, including volunteers and family members of Ukrainian service members, and provide legal and social guarantees for Belarusian volunteers and the families of those who have been killed, wounded, gone missing, or been taken prisoner.

THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE DEMOCRATIC FORCES OF BELARUS COMMIT TO:

- coordinating positions and actions with Ukrainian partners on security, targeted sanctions, and the promotion of shared positions at the international level, within their respective mandates and competencies;
- supporting the documentation of crimes and the accountability of individuals whose responsibility is established by competent national or international authorities;
- supporting Ukraine's right to self-defense and the restoration of its territorial integrity within its internationally recognized borders;
- jointly countering Russian propaganda, disinformation, and other hybrid threats to Belarus and Ukraine;

- working toward ending Russia's military and political control over Belarus, securing the withdrawal of Russian troops, military facilities, and nuclear weapons, and restoring the country's full sovereignty.

Cooperation between a sovereign, democratic Belarus and Ukraine should become an important pillar of security in Eastern Europe. It should be based on sovereign equality, mutual respect, good neighborly relations, a shared European choice, and the principle that the territory of one state must never be used for aggression against another.
